




Valley Professionals Community Health Center celebrated ten years of growth, expanded services, increased employment and healthier communities in 2018.

Valley Professionals opened its first health center on February 5, 2008, located in Clinton, primarily serving residents of Vermillion and Parke counties. Since that time, the health center has grown to serve communities across four counties in Indiana and the surrounding areas. The health center operates six health center facilities located in Clinton, Cayuga, Bloomingdale, Rockville, Crawfordsville and Terre Haute, as well as a mobile health center.

By visiting Valley Professionals, patients can receive integrated care services under one roof. Services provided include primary health care, behavioral health, dental, and patient support services. Over 18,000 patients were served by the health center in 2018, with 73,527 patient visits overall.

The growth of Valley Professionals has undoubtedly increased access to health care services, provided economic impact, as well as eliminating barriers for vulnerable populations by providing resources for needs such as transportation, health insurance, medication, and food.

"When I took over as CEO in 2015, my vision was and still is, to focus on the opportunities that exist in our community," stated T.J. Warren, CEO of Valley Professionals. "With the help of a supportive board and dedicated staff, I feel we have made great progress towards this vision by creating many new jobs and recruiting very successful providers to our rural underserved areas."

Since opening in 2008, staffed with only 11 employees, the health center has proved to be a strong employer for the local communities. By 2013, the number of employees climbed to 52, including full-time and part-time positions. To date, the health center employs 171 people across all of its clinics.

The health center takes extreme pride in their recognition through the National Association of Quality Assurance as a Patient-Centered Medical Home, which provides all-inclusive primary care that creates partnerships between patients and their family and the primary care provider and health care team. This format of patient care allows the health center to work hand in hand with patients in generating better results of health and wellness, and further creating healthier individuals and communities.

Family Medicine Residency

Valley Professionals collaborates and partners with Union Hospital Family Medicine Residency Program, through care of our patients at the Terre Haute health center. Patients see physicians in training, known as Residents. Residents are physicians learning the art and science of family medicine under the guidance and supervision of experienced, board-certified family medicine physicians. The Union Hospital Family Medicine Residency exists to educate and prepare physicians to provide full-spectrum family medicine. By working together, physicians of the Union Hospital Family Medicine Residency Program are able to engage with Valley Professionals' patients and provide valuable hands-on patient care experiences.



Your Home for Healthcare

Valley Professionals employs an integrated care model allowing clinics to service a variety health care needs under one roof. We are proud to be your home for healthcare, and to offer these services in addition to primary and behavioral health care.



Dental

Valley Professionals provides dental services at the Cayuga and Crawfordsville health centers. Dental services include preventive, restorative and emergency services, such as dental exams and screenings, x-rays, cleanings, sealants, fluoride treatments, broken or chipped teeth, extractions, infection, and fillings. We also provide dental education to keep patients informed on how to improve their dental health.

Dental services at Valley Professionals provides a primary focus upon the underserved population currently without a dental home. As a safety net dental provider, Valley Professionals offers basic preventive and restorative procedures to those who are most in need. We work with local schools, local dentists, and oral health specialists to help strengthen the dental system, providing care to all regardless of their ability to pay. Valley Professionals also focuses on pediatric disease prevention and education, with the goal of limiting future restorative needs.

It's also important to note how our dental services also tie into primary medical care and behavioral health. When an individual is having health complications, it can affect many areas of their overall well-being. With having each of these services available in one location, it allows our medical staff to work together and treat the patient as a whole, establishing a medical home for them, as well as further developing healthier communities.

Dr. Brad J. Smith, DDS leads the dental team, along with a Registered Dental Hygienist and trained dental assistants.





Chiropractic

Valley Professionals is proud to offer pain relief to our patients through chiropractic services. Patients can be referred to chiropractic services by their primary care provider. Services are provided by Dr. Dion Snider at our Clinton location, including treatment for:

- Low Back Pain
- Neck Pain
- Headaches
- Carpal Tunnel
- Sciatica
- Muscle aches and pains
- Degenerative Conditions



Pregnancy & Family Services

A unique service to Valley Professionals' patients includes pregnancy and family care services at the Terre Haute health center. Patients are able to access this care through free pregnancy testing, complete prenatal care with delivery and newborn care, ultrasounds, access to childbirth and breast feeding classes, as well as birth control options and counseling.

All insurances are accepted and financial assistance is available for uninsured and underinsured patients, including immediate pregnancy Medicaid sign-up. The pregnancy and family care services can also provide support through counseling to quit smoking, as well as an incentive program with credits for Helping Hands items.



Valley Addictions Program

Valley Addictions Program (VAP) is a specialized program designed to meet the unique needs of individuals with substance-related disorders. The program's goal is to provide a structured and time-limited treatment which:

- Reduces the symptoms and difficulties associated with substance abuse disorders.
- Develops and maintains a sober lifestyle.
- Repairs the individual's ability to function in the family, at work, and in the community.



School-Based Services

The Valley Professionals Mobile School-Based Health Center (MSBHC) is a medical clinic on wheels that travels to schools in Parke, Vermillion, and Vigo counties. The mobile health center began serving students in August 2012. It provides a full range of primary care and behavioral health services so that students can avoid health-related absences and get additional support to help them succeed in the classroom. The mobile health center is staffed by a nurse practitioner and nurse who are ready to provide scheduled, on-site access during the academic day when school is in session. Students and others can be seen for acute problems, such as immunizations, well-child visits, cold, fever, vomiting, congestion, sore throat, flu symptoms, cough, rash, earache, or other similar symptoms. The purpose of school-based services is to work directly with local schools to deliver school-based behavioral health tailored to student needs. These services are for students whose behavioral and/or emotional challenges compromise his or her ability to attend to learning activities. Valley Professionals conveniently provides behavioral health services for students while they are at school. This allows students to receive additional support in a familiar environment. Dental

Valley Professionals is making it easier to maintain your healthy smile with school-based dental services. Our dentist and Licensed Dental Hygienist visit local schools to provide dental examinations, cleanings, and education for students while they are at school. Transforming how we care for our patients.



Valley Professionals provides services to aid patients throughout all stages of life. One of the programs available through the health-center is Baby & Me — Tobacco Free, which aids women in quitting smoking to achieve their goal of delivering a healthy baby. Through this program, Carrie Evans, Baby & Me program director at Valley Professionals, has had the opportunity to change many lives. One of the most prominent experiences focuses around a young future mother who had struggled with a nicotine addiction for years. Upon learning she was expecting a child, she realized that is was time to make a change. Through the Baby & Me program, this patient attended four prenatal sessions where she received help in the quitting process, and after having the baby, attended post-partum visits as well. At each of these visits, since she stayed smoke-free, she also received a voucher for free diapers. This young mother and child were not the only one's impacted; her strength and determination to quit motivated her entire multigen-

erational home to guit alongside her. This step she took with the program shifted the culture the baby was born into. The Baby & Me program has also helped change the lives of many couples who have guit together to provide a healthier lifestyle for their children. One mom and dad team, motivated by each other and dedicated to their child's health, worked long and hard to guit their habits, realizing that guitting can reduce the child's risk of dying of SIDS, increase the likelihood of a healthy delivery, reduce the risk of miscarriage, and increase the baby's oxygen intake. The father was a truck driver, and as many smoker's know, driving can be one of the most challenging parts of quitting. However, with the help of the Baby & Me program and the desire for a higher quality of life, this mom and dad duo kept each other on track, using the resources Valley Professionals provides to be as healthy as possible.








Patient **Demographics**

January - December 2018










Patient Age

Quality Improvement

Quality improvement at Valley Professionals means providing excellent care to our patients while ensuring their safety and satisfaction in a way that gives our health center meaningful results. These results include better patient outcomes, such as being able to assist patients in improving their quality of life through prevention and chronic disease management.

Clinical Quality Measures

IVD: Aspirin Use

*Patients age 18 and older who had an AMI, CABG or PCI in the past 24 months or have an active diagnosis of IVD and have documented use of aspirin

Hypertension: Blood Pressure Control

*Patients age 18-85 years with a diagnosis of HTN whose blood pressure was adequately controlled at less than 140/90.

Diabetes: HbA1c <9

 $^{\star}\text{Patients}$ age 18-75 years with a diagnosis of DM, whose last hemoglobin A1c test was less than 9%

Depression Screening and Follow-up

*Percent of patients age 12 and older screened for depression on the date of the visit using an age-appropriate standardized depression screening tool *and* if positive, a follow-up plan is documented on the date of the positive screen.

Well-Child Examinations (3-6 years)

*Percent of patients aged 3 to 6 years, seen for at least one office visit, who had a documented well-child visit during the measurement year.

Adolescent Wellness Examinations (12-17 years)



Patient-Centered Medical Home

The National Committee for Quality Assurance's Patient-Centered Medical Home is an innovative program for improving primary care and is structured as a health care setting that facilitates partnerships between individual patients and their personal physicians and the patient's family. In order to receive this recognition, Valley Professionals met rigorous standards set forth by NCQA concerning patient access to care, care coordination, continuity of care and accountability, as well as quality and safety. This project included the review of all clinic policies and procedures, as well as the creation and review of many reports on performance outcomes. Upcoming in 2019 will include the Rockville site achieving PCMH recognition and the recognized sites going through their annual renewal process to maintain recognition.

Transforming how we care for our patients.



Patient Care Coordinators are your partners in wellness. They work with your Primary Care and Behavioral Health providers to help you improve your overall health and decrease risks of complications.

Over the last year, I have had the great pleasure of working with a patient on a variety of life issues. As a Care Coordinator, I first met the patient for diabetic education, referred by her physician. Her Hemoglobin A1c that day was 8.4 and she weighed over 200 lbs. She had a long history of weight gain and loss, always by "starving herself". We discussed her dietary habits and how to simply manage her Type 2 diabetes. She was eager to learn, but had little understanding on simple changes she could make that would both drop her blood sugar numbers and also help her with weight loss. She followed the changes that we agreed upon and repeatedly over the next months I heard her exclaim "I feel like I'm cheating! I'm eating all the time, I'm never hungry and I keep losing weight!" Over the course of 3 months, she dropped her A1c to 6.8 and at 6 months had lost 37 pounds.

I urged her to get physical therapy to help with the balance issues she had due to a back injury, and we worked to find a place that fit her needs. She strengthened her legs and began walking longer distances again. Her self-confidence grew and allowed her to then begin to address some emotional issues she was struggling with. She grew to enjoy her therapy with our behavioral health clinician and is a support to her family and friends in the community. Our next goal is smoking cessation! This patient is one that brings me joy in my job. As trained nurses, we understand that change is difficult, but have tools to offer anyone who asks.


